CLUBHOUSE MEMORY VERSE (5 MIN)

CLUBHOUSE MEMORY VERSE activities teach children a memory verse in addition to the one they learn in Quest.

VERSE VOICES

BEFORE THE ACTIVITY:

WHAT YOU NEED: none

What you say: "This month, our Clubhouse memory verse helps us remember what God made."

DURING THE ACTIVITY

What you do: Say the memory verse and do the motions in front of the children. After showing them once, encourage children to practice the memory verse with you while pretending to be a different animal from the list below. You can use all of the voice options or choose a few, depending on time and interest.

What you say: "I am going to say our memory verse. Everyone watch me! (Demonstrate the memory verse.) Now let's do it all together! Are you ready? (Say the memory verse with the motions several times.) Now let's try the verse while pretending to be some of the animals God made!"

- "Say the verse while hopping like a bunny!"
- "Say the verse while slithering like a snake!"
- "Say the verse while swimming like a fish!"
- "Say the verse while **flying** like a bird!"
- "Say the verse while **crawling** like a tiger!"
- "Say the verse while waddling like a penguin!"
- "Say the verse while stomping like an elephant!"

MEMORY VERSE:

"In the beginning (circle arms overhead)

God created (point up)

the heavens (wave arms back and forth)

and the earth." (point down)

Genesis 1:1, NIV (open hands like a book)

AFTER THE ACTIVITY

What you do: Give children the opportunity to say the memory verse on their own. Each child who can say the memory verse correctly will get 2,000 points.

NOTE: Children can say the memory verse from Clubhouse **or** Quest to earn points.

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QUEST LESSON PLAN



When we take time to look at this amazing world God made, we are filled with awe and wonder. It's that feeling of wonder we want children to have as they learn about God's creation. We are going to do a lot of counting together this month — one, two, three, four, five, six, seven — pausing to learn what God made on each day of creation. Through our fun and exciting activities and stories, we want our preschoolers to learn God made everything, and IT IS GOOD!

WEEKLY MAIN POINTS

Week 1: On days one and two, God made the light, dark, sky, and water.

Week 2: On day three, God made the land, plants, and sea.

WEEK 3: ON DAY FOUR, GOD MADE THE SUN, MOON, AND STARS.

Week 4: On days five and six, God made the birds, fish, and animals.

Week 5: On day six, God made the most special thing: people. Then, He rested.

BIBLE CONNECT (10 MIN)

BIBLE CONNECT helps children make connections to the Bible by hearing and talking about the Bible story.

SUN, MOON, AND STARS GENESIS 1:14-19

BEFORE THE ACTIVITY

What you need: God's Story for Me Bible, Bible story stickers

What you say: "We can find true stories in God's Word, the Bible!"

DURING THE ACTIVITY

What you do: Show and read the Bible story from pages 10-15 in the God's Story for Me Bible. Ask the Bible story review questions. Each time a child answers a question correctly, give the child a sticker. If children can't remember the answer. take time as a group to look back through the Bible and find the answer together.

What you say: "Let's see how much you remember from our Bible story!"

- 1. "Did God finish creating the world after three days?" (no)
- 2. "On day four, did God make special lights or leaves in the sky?" (lights)
- 3. "What did God make to shine in the daytime?" (the sun)
- 4. "What did God make to glow at night?" (the moon)
- 5. "What did God make that twinkle in the sky?" (the stars)
- 6. "Did God create one star or many stars?" (many stars)
- 7. "Did God finish creating the world after day four?" (no)

AFTER THE ACTIVITY

What you say: "God made amazing things on day four! He made the sun, moon, and stars. Who made everything?" (God made everything.)

YOU CONNECT (10 MIN)

YOU CONNECT helps children make connections with the main point and their lives.

MAKE A MOON

BEFORE THE ACTIVITY

What you need: activity page (1 per child), star stickers (6 per child), crayons, paint dabbers

What you say: "In our Bible story, we learned that on the fourth day of creation, God made the sun, moon, and stars. Let's make a fun craft that will help us remember what God made."

DURING THE ACTIVITY

What you do: Give each child an activity page and help them write their name on the back. Then, point to the circle in the middle of the activity page and explain they'll make it into a moon. Follow the prompts below to help children review the Bible story and make their craft.

What you say:

- "On day four, God created the sun to shine during the day and the moon to glow at night. If you're glad God made the sun and the moon, use a yellow paint dabber to make a moon by adding dots inside the circle. Then, use a black crayon to color the night sky around the moon."
- "One day four, God also created the stars that twinkle in the sky at night. If you're glad God made the stars, put six star stickers around the moon on your activity page." (Give each child six star stickers and encourage them to put them on their activity page.)

AFTER THE ACTIVITY

What you say: "Great job! You can take your craft home. Every time you look at it, remember that God made everything! Who made everything? (God made everything.) Let's bow our heads and close our eyes and thank God for making such wonderful things for us to enjoy. Dear God, You are the only one who can make something from nothing. You are that powerful! We want to thank You for making the sun, moon, and stars. We think You are awesome! In Jesus' name, amen."
