Agent Identity

Supplies: white labels, black ink pad

When each child arrives, help them make an agent name tag for the party. First, write their name on the name tag. Then, use the black ink pad and the child's index finger to make a fingerprint inside the box on the name tag. Peel the name tag off and put it on the front of each child.

Operation Laser Beam

Supplies: Yarn, goodie bags with prizes

String yarn across a room from one side to the other, taping it to the walls. Repeat as many times as you'd like until you have enough string to make it difficult for children to go through. Place the goodie bags on the opposite side of the room as the starting line, and challenge each child to make it through the yarn, get a goodie bag, and make it back without touching the laser beams.

Secret Decoder

Supplies: white paper, a white crayon, watercolor paint, paintbrushes

Think of different messages you want to tell the kids. With the white crayon, write a message on each white piece of paper (you can do this ahead of time.) Then, allow each child to use the watercolor paint and paintbrushes to paint over the crayon. The secret message will be revealed instantly!

Sneaky Spy

Supplies: Black and red balloons

Cover the floor of one room with black balloons, and 5 to 6 red balloons. Challenge each child to cross from one side of the room to the other by navigating through the black balloons and avoiding the red balloons. If a child touches a red balloon, then they are out. Continue adding red balloons each round until there is a winner!
