# CONTINUE THE CONVERSATION

Listed in bold are the activities your child completed in eKidz. Use the activities they completed with the information below to supplement what they are learning this month. Each activity reviews our monthly focus and Bible story, and provides you focused interaction with your child.

## July 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>: Joshua's Men and the Wall [crown]

Use the *Joshua's Men and the Wall* crown to review the Bible story with your toddler. Sit on the floor with your toddler and put the crown in the center. Point to the stone wall and say, "Joshua and his men needed to get into the city of Jericho but there was a HUGE stone wall. God told Joshua to walk around the wall once each day for six days. Let's march around the wall six times." Stand up and march around the wall (crown), each time counting out loud the time around. After marching six times, say, "on the seventh day, Joshua and his men marched and played trumpets and shouted. Let's march around the wall one time and make lots of noise!" March around the wall one more time, making lots of noise. Say, "after Joshua and his men march, the wall came tumbling down! Joshua trusted God. God wants us to trust Him too!"

## July 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>: The Wall [coloring page]

Grab *The Wall* coloring page and hold up so you child can see it. Point to the people in the picture. Say, "Joshua trusted God and marched around the wall. Because Joshua trusted God and did what God said, the wall came tumbling down!" Sing the **March Around** song with your toddler.

## July 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>: Blow the Trumpets! [activity]

Visit the eKidz Blog on Monday, July 23, to download the Bible story to read to your child. (The Bible story is also on the back of last weekends coloring page.) Have your child sit with you with the trumpet he or she brought home from eKidz. When you reach the line in the story that says, "On the seventh time around, the priests blew trumpets and Joshua led the people to shout with loud voices!" encourage your child to blow their trumpet. After you finish reading the story, say, "because Joshua trusted God and and did what God said the wall came tumbling down! God wants us to trust Him, too!"

## July 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>: The Falling Wall [snack]

We saw some expert builders this weekend in eKidz as your toddlers recreated an edible wall of Jericho! This week build your own edible wall with your toddler. Say, "God told Joshua and his army to march around the wall of Jericho. Let's build a wall." Spread 1/2 inch of whipped cream cheese on a plate and give your child graham crackers. Help your child stand the graham crackers up in the cream cheese to build the walls of Jericho. Say, "Joshua and his army marched for seven days, and on the seventh day played trumpets and shouted. Let's shout!" Make noise and shout. Say, "After Joshua and his army made lots of noise, the walls came tumbling down! Let's shake our wall and make it tumble down!" Help your children shake their plates. Say, "Joshua trusted God and did what He said, and we can trust God too! God wants us to trust Him!"

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
